WHAT IS DIGITAL EQUITY?

Digital Equity is the condition in which internet access, affordability, and the ability to use digital technologies to reach important goals is possible for everyone.

This means everyone is equally able to benefit from the educational, economic, employment, and health opportunities that the internet provides.

WHAT LIMITS DIGITAL EQUITY?

Digital Equity is limited by a range of barriers that prevent people from having home internet service, acquiring quality devices, gaining the skills they need, or having access to technical assistance.

These barriers may be related to larger socioeconomic factors or may be a consequence of location, language, and physical abilities.

WHAT ADVANCES DIGITAL EQUITY?

Digital Equity is advanced through the practices, policies, and programs that make it possible for everyone to operate under digitally equitable conditions. Together, these activities are referred to as "Digital Inclusion."

Digital Inclusion activities include providing low-cost device and internet service plans as well as free and locally available training and IT support in accessible and inclusive locations.

NEW MEXICO DIGITAL EQUITY PLAN

To increase Digital Inclusion activities and achieve Digital Equity, New Mexico is creating a state Digital Equity Plan.

The plan will develop and implement the Digital Inclusion actions needed across the state to make Digital Equity for all New Mexicans a reality.

TRIBAL DIGITAL EQUITY PLANNING

NTIA received 470 Letters of Intent from tribes in 29 states Tribal entities were required to submit letter of intent to NTIA before July 12, 2022.

"Federally recognized tribes who have not signaled their intent to participate in the program directly are still able to provide feedback to state planning efforts."

TRIBAL DIGITAL EQUITY PLANNING

Letters of Intent were submitted to NTIA by 18 tribes in New Mexico and 2 Navajo organizations (NM, AZ, UT)

SEN is the foundation for the STATE MIDDLE MILE

- **▶** Nodes
 - Upgrading electrical and cooling systems for HigherEd facilities housing SEN Nodes
- ► Major Routes/Internet
 - Adding key "Middle Mile" corridors, closing of rings for resiliency (a "box" around the SEN)
- "Meet Me" and aggregation points become launching points for "Last Mile"

AFFORDABLE CONNECTIVITY PROGRAM (ACP)

- \$30 per month for internet service for eligible households
- \$75 per month for households on qualifying Tribal lands
- One-time discount of up to \$100 to purchase a laptop, desktop computer, or tablet from participating providers

- The pilot will initially target 20 Tribal libraries that are new to the program or have had challenges applying in the past.
