

Tribal Competitive Outreach Program (TCOP) Deadline July 28, 2023

TCOP provides funding for outreach activities to increase awareness of and encourage

participation in the Affordable Connectivity Program (ACP) for households on Tribal Lands.

The maximum amount TCOP applicants may apply for is \$400,000.

OBAE Tribal Consultation Broadband Challenges

The Broadband Office is currently in the planning process for broadband infrastructure and digital inclusion programming across the state. Utilizing

Broadband Equity Access and Deployment Program (BEAD) and Digital Equity (DE), OBAE is creating a Five-Year Action Plan to guide the state's efforts to provide all New Mexicans with reliable broadband internet access. **This plan will help identify each unique challenge your Tribe may be experiencing regarding access to high-speed internet**. Once the challenges are identified, OBAE will assist in coordinating state and Tribal, Nations, and Pueblos resources to overcome these challenges through BEAD and DE funding.

NM Awarded \$675M from White House High-Speed Broadband Internet Initiative

New Mexico will receive \$675 million from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law to expand broadband access across the state.

"It is no accident that this funding made up the largest percentage of the federal Bipartisan Infrastructure Law; broadband projects are incredibly expensive and a vital part (of) every aspect of our lives," Gov. Michelle Lujan Grisham said in a press release. "This funding empowers New Mexico to continue to bridge the digital divide and create equal opportunities for our residents. I'm grateful to President Biden and New Mexico's Congressional delegation for their roles in securing this funding for our state."

The \$675,372,311 in funding comes from the federal Broadband Equity Access and Deployment program under the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.

Biden Official Praises New Mexico's Broadband Work Announcement Made at Santa Fe Indian School

The state is poised to receive more than \$675 million from the \$1 trillion infrastructure law passed in 2021 to expand broadband in underserved communities.

As New Mexico gears up for an influx of federal funding to enhance broadband access for residents, a leading Biden administration official praised state leaders for moving quickly to secure the money.

New Mexico is "leading on this issue from soup to nuts," Mitch Landrieu, President Joe Biden's point person on infrastructure, said Thursday afternoon at a news conference at Santa Fe Indian School.

Honoring Joe Garcia A Champion of Ensuring Tribes Had Access to Broadband

In May of 2023, Indian Country lost a great tribal leader, Mr. Joe Garcia. Mr. Garcia was an electrical engineer by profession, earning an electrical engineering degree from the University of New Mexico. In June 2003, he retired from the Los Alamos National Laboratory after 25 years of service. As a tribal leader for his Pueblo Ohkay Owingeh in New Mexico and a national leader as President of the National Congress of American Indians, he was a longtime

proponent of education and a champion of ensuring tribes had access to broadband.

Biden-Harris Administration Announces \$4.5 Million in Internet for All Grants to Tribal Lands

The Department of Commerce's National Telecommunications and Information Administration (NTIA) announced on May 24th it has awarded grants totaling \$4.5 million to 9 Tribes as part of the <u>Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program</u> (TBCP).

With funding from the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law, these new grants bring the total of the program to over \$1.77 billion awarded to 166 Tribal entities. Record investments in high-speed internet deployment are a key part of President Biden's Investing in America agenda.

These grants from President Biden's <u>Internet for All</u> initiative will help reduce monthly Internet service costs, plan for future Internet infrastructure investments, upgrade network equipment, and purchase devices.

In the next few months, NTIA will release a second Notice of Funding Opportunity for an additional round of funding from the TBCP program.

NTIA Advancing Internet For All Mapping Challenge Continues

In order to meet the urgency of this moment to connect the unconnected, NTIA will continue to target June 30 as the date by which they will allocate each state and territory's BEAD Program funding for high-speed Internet service. NTIA and the FCC have worked closely with states to assist them in the process of improving

the National Broadband Map to achieve this goal.
