## Pueblo of Acoma Awarded the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program Grant

*Congratulations!*

The National Telecommunications & Information Administration (NTIA) awarded the Tribal Broadband Connectivity Program (TBCP) grant award to the Pueblo of Acoma.

The TBCP, part of President Biden's Internet for All initiative, offers grants to eligible Native American, Alaska Native, and Native Hawaiian entities for high-speed internet deployment, digital inclusion, workforce development, telehealth, and distance learning.

The Pueblo of Acoma was awarded \$14,346,244.00. This Broadband Infrastructure Deployment project proposes to install fiber to directly connect 1,167 unserved Native American households and anchor institutions with a minimum of 25/3 Mbps service.

## NTIA's Internet for All Initiative Request for Comment

NTIA's [Internet for All](#) initiative is to promote adoption and meaningful



use of the Internet among underrepresented communities and populations, including low-income households, veterans, aging individuals, racial and ethnic minorities, rural residents and others.

The State Digital Equity Capacity Grant and the Competitive Digital Equity Program aim to ensure that everyone in America has the skills, technology, and capacity needed to reap the full benefits of our digital economy.

Secretary of Commerce Gina Raimondo announced a **Request for Comment**, “We need to hear directly from those who are most impacted by the systemic barriers that prevent some from fully utilizing the Internet.”

This request for comment is part of NTIA’s larger strategy to hear from a diverse set of voices while implementing high-speed Internet grant programs. **NTIA requests feedback on the design, rules, and evaluation criteria for both digital equity programs.**

## NTIA Advancing Internet For All Mapping Challenge Continues

In order to meet the urgency of this moment to connect the unconnected, NTIA will continue to target June 30 as the date by which they will allocate each state and territory’s BEAD Program funding for high-speed Internet service. NTIA and the FCC have worked closely with states to assist them in the process of improving the [National Broadband Map](#) to achieve this goal.

**NTIA encourages states to continue to submit challenges to this map**, which is meant to be a living document. Continued improvements will move us that much closer in making Internet for All a reality.
